Two Years of COVID-19 Vaccination

December 2022 marked two years since the first COVID-19 vaccine was administered in the U.S. Although too many lives have been lost to COVID-19 since the start of the pandemic, vaccination has helped prevent millions of hospitalizations and saved millions of lives.

Stay up to date on your vaccines to protect yourselves, your loved ones, and your community against COVID-19. As with other vaccine-preventable diseases, you are protected best from COVID-19 when you stay up to date with the recommended vaccinations, including recommended boosters.

Get an updated bivalent booster at least 2 months after completing your primary series or last booster. If you've had COVID-19, you may delay getting your booster by 3 months since your symptoms ended.

Mask Guidance and the "Tripledemic"

COVID-19, the flu, and RSV are surging in many parts of the country in what health experts and news media are calling a "tripledemic" of respiratory illnesses. With cases and



hospitalizations on the rise, some public health authorities are revisiting indoor mask guidance.

The CDC continues to recommend that people wear masks indoors in areas with a high COVID-19 Community Level. But regardless of Community Level, anyone can wear a mask as an additional precaution to protect themselves and their families from respiratory infections during the holiday season. Use our new Answers to Tough Questions on the "tripledemic", Talking Points and Answers to Tough Questions on overall mask guidance and the CDC Community Level, and our "What Mask Should I Wear?" graphic to promote use of the most effective kinds of masks this winter.
