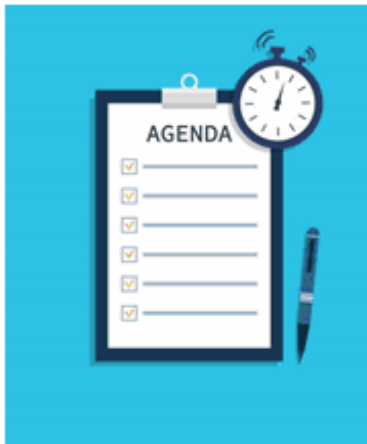

NACCHO is launching a standing all Local Health Official (LHO) to build connection across the LHO community, ensure timely updates, and allow for dialogue and discussion with federal partners on a regular basis. These calls are a direct result of feedback from you, our members, about the need to better connect with each other and federal partners. Please plan to attend monthly to not only hear updates on guidance and initiatives from CDC, FDA, or other federal partners, but also to ask questions and give feedback to ensure federal efforts are workable locally. If you cannot attend, please designate a senior deputy to join when needed.

CDC's new Office of Public Health Data, Surveillance, and Technology is building on our shared data modernization history and setting a future vision for advancing data for public health action. During this meeting, OPHDST will outline that vision for addressing longstanding pain points and how public health can more fully leverage the substantial investment made in health IT. To get there, we must take a "one public health approach." OPHDST will also share how they will continue to support STLTs in modernization and how you can help them design, test, and build solutions for public health holistically.
