Mandatory Reporting Considerations - Join us to discuss the evolution of reporting child abuse and neglect

On behalf of our New Jersey Department of Children and Families, and, Advocates for Children of New Jersey, please note this vital announcement and invitation.

On October 7, 2024 from 9:00 – 3:30 at the Westin, Forrestal Village in Princeton, the NJ Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect will host professionals from New Jersey's health care, education and law enforcement communities, to hear from child welfare experts about mandatory reporting and ways we can empower and assist families to prevent child abuse and neglect.

For context, over 35% of all American children – and over 50% of America's Black children – will be reported to a CPS hotline before turning 18.* Overwhelmingly these reports are allegations of neglect, and are ultimately unfounded. Many jurisdictions across the United States – including New

Jersey – are beginning to examine the dynamics surrounding neglect investigations, taking steps to ensure that efforts to help families in poverty do not unnecessarily involve the child protection system, while also ensuring that children are kept safe from harm.

Race, Poverty and Neglect: Focus Group Session

CALLING ALL MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS WORKING WITH CHILDREN IN NJ! The New Jersey Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect's Subcommittee on Race, Poverty and Neglect is seeking input from child-serving health professionals about their experiences with identifying and/or reporting child neglect.

We are looking for medical professionals who can participate in a 90 minute focus group. The sessions will be facilitated by an independent research group. Results will be summarized by the research team and reported in aggregate form. Any responses, including any quotes, will not be linked to a participant.

Background: Through this exercise, the Subcommittee seeks to better understand how children are assessed for neglect and the pathways through which families suspected of child neglect are encountering the child welfare system. The Subcommittee's members include representatives from health care, academia, child advocacy, and local human services, as well as representatives from the NJ Departments of Human Services, Education, and Children and Families, and parents with lived experience in the child protection system. The Subcommittee will use input from you and other child-serving professionals to inform recommendations to the NJ Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect. Individuals who sign up for a focus group will be offered a copy of the related report once it is released.

PH Infrastructure Saves Lives

Senator Patty Murray (D-WA) reintroduced the **Public Health Infrastructure Saves Lives Act**. Organizations can endorse the bill using **this form**. The bill would address chronic underfunding of state, local, tribal and territorial (SLTT) public health infrastructure through a dedicated investment in foundational public health capabilities and workforce. The Public Health Infrastructure Saves Lives Act Background



The Public Health Infrastructure Saves Lives Act would establish a Core Public Health Infrastructure Program at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), awarding grants to state, local, tribal and territorial health departments to ensure they have the tools, workforce, and systems in place to address existing and emerging health threats and reduce health disparities.

Foundational Capablities of Public Health



Assessment – disease surveillance, epidemiology and laboratory capacity



All Hazards Preparedness and Response – the capacity to respond to public health threats



Policy Development & Support – the ability to serve as expert resource for public health policy



Communications – the ability to translate public health science to messaging for media, public, healthcare



Community Partnership – the ability to convene and build strategic partnerships across sectors



Leadership & Governance - the ability to lead internal and external stakeholders to consensus and action



Accountability – Performance management and quality improvement



Equity – the capacity to end and prevent disparities and promote optimal health in all communities





New Data: Mental Health is a Bipartisan Issue

One in four U.S. adults screened positively for depression, according to a new analysis from the COVID-19 and Life Stressors Impact on Mental Health and Well-Being (CLIMB) study. There were no significant differences among party affiliations, though the unmet need for treatment was highest among Republicans.

These findings point to depression and mental health as an area of unity in a polarized country. Read more about the findings, published today in the Journal of Public Health Management and Practice.

Cyber Threat Highlights

Pension Plan Help Scams

Threat actors continue to target pension plans and use social engineering tactics to initiate contact and appear legitimate. They may contact their targets by email, phone, text message, social media, or online advertisements and falsely claim to offer a "free" review of their pension plan savings with the promise of better returns. They may also attempt to obtain personal information, compromise pension plan accounts, update direct deposit information, and transfer or release funds to attacker-controlled accounts.
